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

RESOLUTION NO. 520

"A RESOLUTION FOR SEEKING REPEAL OF T.C.A. SECTION 37-2-205(F)"

WHEREAS, during its 2009 session, the Tennessee Legislature adopted Public Chapter No. 531, Section 30, known as the "Over-Commitment Law" which amended T.C.A. Section 37-2-205 by adding a new subsection (f); and

WHEREAS, this law provides that if a county exceeds a certain limit on the number of children committed to the custody of the Tennessee Department of Children's Services, the county shall be billed for the cost to the state of providing care for the children during the children's stay in state custody; and

WHEREAS, the cost of providing care for children in state custody has always been paid by the state, and should continue to be paid by the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Carter County Commission that Carter County's State Senator and State Representative be urged to seek and support the repeal of T.C.A. Section 37-2-205(f); and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Mayor deliver a copy of this resolution to Carter County's State Senator and State Representative.

Under Public Comments Roy Livingston stated the County had failed to take any action in an ongoing dispute about the Ice House Saloon in Hampton. He stated alcohol was still being sold on the property in violation of statutes setting a precedent for the entire county. He said that he had been given no answers to his questions regarding the legality of the property and that somebody needed to make a decision. Thelma Hite spoke on the lack of "nuisance" laws in the County complaining of barking dogs, junk cars and rat infestation in her neighborhood. She suggested that citizens set up town hall meetings to air their grievances. Bobby Taylor again encouraged the County to allow tax payers to be able to make installments on their property taxes. This would ease their burden of a lump sum payment during tax time. He also suggested that the Commission minutes as well as minutes of public meetings be published on the Internet for easier access. Jim Dabbondanza stated that problems brought before the Commission each month by citizens should be addressed by the Commissioners in a more timely manner.

Jo Ann Blankenship stated that under the 1981 Act the budget was to be passed in July. After a brief recess to discuss the matter and in an effort to avoid violating the 1981 Act, Commissioner Montgomery amended his motion to a "recommendation" to the Budget Committee that no increases in the budget be made until September 1.
