SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED. by the County Commission of Carter County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session at Elizabethton, Tennessee, on this 15th day of July, 2013, with a lawful quorum of said Commission being present and with a majority of said Commission voting in the affirmative, that the combined property tax rate of Carter County Tennessee, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014, shall be \$2.40 2.33 on each \$100.00 of taxable property, which is to provide revenue for each of the following funds and otherwise conform to the following levies;

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there is hereby levied a gross receipts tax as provided by law. The proceeds of the gross receipts tax herein levied shall accrue to the General Fund.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all resolutions of the Board of County Commissioners of Carter County, Tennessee, which are in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the County Commission of Carter County, Tennessee, in the County Clerk's records.

however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any appropriations made by this resolution which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures for any office, agency, institution, division or department for the year ending June 30, 2014. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissions providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, T.C.A.

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SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes provided such notes are first approved by the State Director of Local Finance to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the year 2013-2014 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each of individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, T.C.A. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 2014.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent County property taxes for the year 2012 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2014 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2012. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all encumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the year at June 30, 2014.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which heretofore has been passed by the Board of County Commissioners which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2013. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.
