WHEREAS, the Carter County Emergency Management Agency has developed a Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan for Carter County and all municipalities therein which is compliant with all state and federal requirements of the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); and

WHEREAS, said Plan has been made available to the public by publication on the Carter County, Tennessee website and may be reviewed in the office of the Carter County Emergency Management Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Board did solicit public input regarding the Plan and allowed for comment at a public hearing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the budget for the School Federal Projects fund shall be the budget approved for separate projects within No Child Left Behind (NCLB), Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA-Part B and Preschool), Carl Perkins Vocational fund and other federal grants by the Carter County Board of Education.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register, Sheriff and the officially authorized deputies and assistants of each may be entitled to receive under state laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register, and Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized

shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any fee officials, as enumerated in T.C.A Section 8-22-101, operate under the provisions of T.C.A. Section 8-22-104 the provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendment to the budget, except for amendments to the budget for funds under supervision of the Director of Schools, shall be approved as provided in T.C.A. Section 5-9-407. The Director of Schools must receive approval of the Board of Education for transfers within each major category of the budget, and approval of both the Board of Education and Board of County Commissioners for transfers between major categories as required by law.

One copy of each amendment shall be filled with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfers from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures for any office, agency, institution, division or department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissions providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved

by the Comptroller of the Treasury after its adoption as provided by T.C.A. Section 9-21-403.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes provided such notes are first approved by the Comptroller of the Treasury to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the fiscal year 2018-2019 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, of the Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 2019.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent county property taxes for the year 2016 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2019 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2016. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all encumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the year shall lapse, and be of no further effect, at the end of the fiscal year on June 30, 2019.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which heretofore has been passed by the Board of County Commissioners which is in conflict with any provision of this resolution shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2018. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.
